Judith Della (Bengtson) Brinkmann (Judy) was born in Litchfield, Minnesota on March 12, 1942, to Harry and Della (Nelson) Bengtson and grew up in Dassel. Judy was a gifted teacher of young children during her long career in private and public schools. She married George Brinkmann October 25, 1969, in the Dassel Covenant Church. Upon his release from active duty in the US Air Force in 1972, they moved to Illinois, living in Peoria and Rockford before settling in Monmouth for the next 36 years. Judy taught early elementary and pre-kindergarten children in a rural public school district until she retired in 2011. The couple moved to Seattle, Washington in 2013 to be close to their daughter and newborn grandson. Judy lived a full life with cancer for seven years, was active in her church and PEO, pursuing her hobbies, enjoying her grandchildren and nurturing old and new friendships. She died peacefully in Seattle on May 12, 2023, after struggling to recover from hip replacement surgery three weeks earlier. Judy was a committed Christian, loving sister, wife, mother and grandmother, a gifted teacher and a loyal friend. She is survived by her husband George, her son Benjamin (Debra), her daughter

Anna, her grandchildren Paul, Gabriella, Katrina, and Charlie, and her brother Bruce (Ruth). She was preceded in death by her parents.
